

MIAD Trustees elect officers, new members

MILWAUKEE – The Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design Board of Trustees has elected three new officers for the 2006-2007 academic year, added five new members and re-elected Board Chair **Claire Hackmann** to her second year of a three-year term. A community volunteer, Hackmann has been a MIAD Trustee since 1996.

The new officers, elected to a three-year term, are:

- **Allen W. (Sandy) Williams, Jr.**, Vice Chair – A partner at Foley & Lardner LLP and a Trustee since 2004 who most recently served as Treasurer.
- **Lawrence Moon**, Treasurer – Chairman and CEO of Sandstone Group and a Trustee since 2000.
- **Linda Stephenson**, Secretary – Community volunteer, retired president and CEO of Zigman Joseph Stephenson and a Trustee since 2001.

The new Board members, elected to a three-year term, are:

- **Jerry Benjamin**, Co-Managing Director of A.B. Data, Ltd., an international company that specializes in marketing, data processing, full-service direct marketing, and class action claims and notice administration services.
- **Pati Ericson**, a lifelong artist whose community involvement includes having served as president of the Kettle Moraine YMCA and as a board member of the West Bend Art Museum.
- **Robert Joseph**, Founder and owner of Joseph Property Development, LLC, which develops residential projects in the Greater Milwaukee area and Milwaukee's Historic Third Ward.
- **Madeleine Kelly Lubar**, a former practicing attorney and a community volunteer with board and committee memberships in such organizations as Congregation Sinai, Neighborhood House of Milwaukee and the Milwaukee Art Museum.
- **Andrea Schloemer**, a painter by profession and community volunteer in the arts and education.

MIAD's 23-member Board of Trustees is the policy-making body for the college, which was founded in 1974 as Wisconsin's only four-year college devoted exclusively to the education of artists and designers. Its board members can serve a maximum of three, three-year terms.
