### **Survivor Advocacy**

Advocates provide support and assistance in the decision-making process to students affected by sexual violence, including sexual assault, relationship violence and stalking. Services are confidential to the extent allowed by law. Advocates will assist you in filing a report to the Milwaukee Police Department and are required to do so by law.

*The advocate can provide upon request:*

- Referrals to Marquette University and community service providers
- Assistance with housing, academic and other related concerns
- Information about reporting options
- Assistance with obtaining restraining orders and no-contact orders
- Assistance and support throughout the student conduct process
- Assistance and support throughout the criminal justice process
